'Mexican Lobster and Steak House' works to describe their specialties, but you'll find plenty of other kinds of food on the menu, such as pasta and some authentic Mexican dishes. As we were waiting for the food, we nibbled on some totopos (corn chips) served with a fresh, surprisingly picante Salsa Mexicana, as it should be.

We decided to try out a selection of goodies in order to bring justice to the menu.

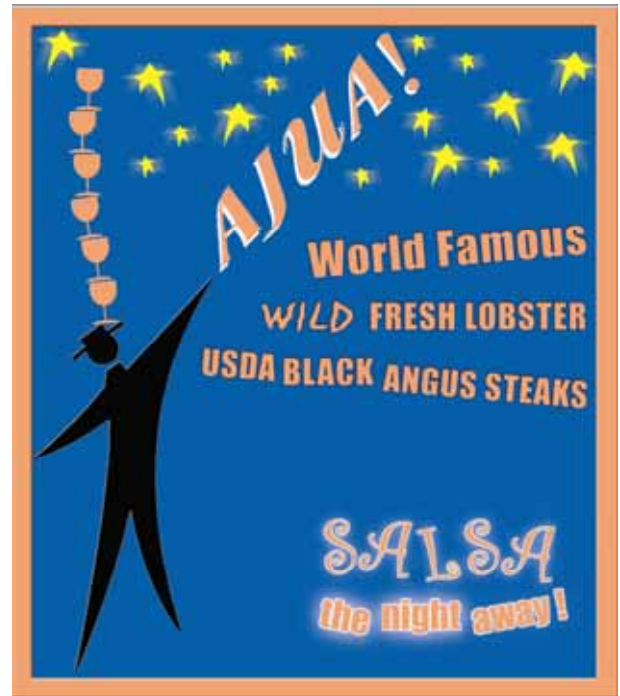
An excellent start of the evening.
